

For Academic Year 2012-2013: Common Factors Weighed for Admission to Dental Hygiene, Medical Laboratory Technology, Physical Therapist Assistant, and Radiography

Admission to these Allied Health programs is competitive based on points being awarded for grades in various courses and/or scores on tests. The following factors are considered in determining which candidates will be admitted to all of the Allied Health programs:

1. High school grade point average or GED scores (for applicants with less than 12 college credits)
2. Cumulative college grade point average (for applicants with 12 college credits or more)
3. ACT or SAT composite score **OR** college degree
4. Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:
 - a. Biology 201 (Human Anatomy)
 - b. Biology 202 (Human Physiology)
 - c. English 151 (Freshman Composition)
 - d. Psychology 201 (Introduction to Psychology)
 - e. Sociology 201 (Introduction to Sociology)

These additional factors will be weighed in determining which applicants will be admitted to each program, respectively:

Dental Hygiene Program

- Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:
 - Chemistry 100 (Fundamentals of Chemistry I) **OR** Chemistry 110 (General Chemistry I)
 - Communications 101 (Foundations of Interpersonal Communication)
 - Biology 205 (Microbiology)

Medical Laboratory Technology Program

- Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:
 - Chemistry 100 (Fundamentals of Chemistry I) **OR** Chemistry 110 (General Chemistry I)
 - Chemistry 111 (General Chemistry II) **OR** Chemistry 210 (Introduction to Organic and Biochemistry)
 - Communications 101 (Foundations of Interpersonal Communication) **OR** Communications 111 (Business and Technical Communication)

Physical Therapist Assistant Program

- Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:
 - Communications 101 (Foundations of Interpersonal Communication)
 - Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) 110 (Medical First Responder Training)
 - Psychology 220 (Developmental Psychology)

Radiography Program

- Specific college courses with a "C" (2.0) or above:
 - Communications 101 (Foundations of Interpersonal Communication)
 - Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) 110 (Medical First Responder Training) **OR** Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) 120 (Basic Emergency Medical Technician Didactic)

2012-2013 Understanding the Allied Health Point Sheet

The Allied Health Point Sheet is used to rank students for selective admission into the Dental Hygiene, Medical Laboratory Technology, Physical Therapist Assistant, and Radiography programs. Only those who have met all of the admission requirements, and who have submitted an Allied Health Application Packet by the program deadline date, will be included in this ranking and selection process. (Please refer to page 1 of this packet for program deadline dates.)

Each applicant will be ranked on SECTIONS A, B, C, and D

SECTION A:

1. The HIGH SCHOOL GPA (GED SCORE) is used to determine the amount of points awarded to applicants with less than 12 college credits, with a maximum of 25 points.

NOTE: No points are awarded for a GPA below 2.5, or a GED score below 45.

If you have 12 college credit hours or more, use CALCULATED COLLEGE GPA – item #2 below.

2. The CALCULATED COLLEGE GPA is used to determine the amount of points awarded to applicants with 12 college credits or more, with a maximum of 25 points. Your calculated college GPA is determined by adding the GPA points earned from EACH college, then adding the GPA hours (or credit hours) from EACH college, and then dividing the total points by the total hours.

NOTE: No points are awarded for a calculated GPA below 2.4.

If you have less than 12 college credit hours, use HIGH SCHOOL GPA (GED SCORE) – item #1 above.

SECTION B:

1. Applicants are awarded points to match the ACT COMPOSITE SCORE, with a maximum of 25 points. A composite score of 13 – 25 will earn points equal to the composite score. A composite score of 26 – 36 will earn 25 points.

NOTE: No points are awarded for an ACT composite score of 12 or below.

If you have an associate degree or higher (from an accredited institution, with a 2.5 GPA or above), and did not submit ACT scores, use COLLEGE DEGREE – item #2 below.

2. A COLLEGE DEGREE from an accredited institution will earn points in lieu of the ACT COMPOSITE SCORE, as long as your GPA from that institution is a 2.5 or above. Points are given for an associate, a bachelor's, or a master's degree.

NOTE: If your GPA is below a 2.5 at the institution from which your degree was earned, no points will be awarded for the degree.

If you do not have a degree from an accredited institution, use ACT COMPOSITE SCORE – item #1 above.

For SECTION B, points are awarded for either ACT COMPOSITE SCORE or COLLEGE DEGREE – not both; however, if you submit documentation for both ACT and DEGREE, we will calculate points using whichever earns the most points.

SECTION C:

GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES: Points are awarded for the specific courses listed. These courses must have been taken at KCC, or transferred to KCC from another college. A grade of C or higher in the 4 general education courses earns 1 point each, with a maximum of 4 points in this section.

SECTION D:

PROGRAM SPECIFIC COURSES: Please refer ONLY to the courses listed under your specific program heading. For each course, a grade of A or A- earns 4 points; a B+, B or B- earns 3 points; and a C+ or C earns 2 points. **A grade of C- or below does not earn points, will not count toward admission or graduation requirements, and will not be accepted.**

+2 POINTS: Two additional points will only be given to applicants who applied to the same program, consecutively, and within the last 3 years, but were not offered a seat in the program. (Maximum: 2 points.)

This guide is information only. Final point totals are calculated by the Admissions office using official documents. Please keep in mind that point totals change each year based on the applicant pool and Admission requirements.
